"1001" - Keep on Your Grind Until the Light Comes On

CREATIVE BRIEF

STOP Motion Animation **1**:

- 1. What must it be?** In a few phrases: *Creative and engaging. Intro and Outro. "Cut Outs?"*. *Modern lab production techniques seem ideal. Adobe Stock graphics and/or video might be appropriate. " Adobe Stock graphics and/or video and Adobe Premiere most likely will also be used to pull all of the visual, music, and sound elements together. I aim to do the piece pretty well for a stop motion and Adobe Premiere novice.*
- 2. Who is it for?** Since I work for an electric utility (where Thomas Edison and Lewis Latimore (Edison's assistant) are featured prominently in the lobby) right now I see the audience potentially being for the *general public and my company*. In that regard, I further thought this short stop motion piece might be useful as a creative and different way of my company *paying homage* to the singularly best known, and most prolific inventor and innovators in our industry and the world.

As a part of larger messaging, and because I plan to feature Edison's African American assistant rather prominently in this Edison piece, also it could be used as a topical light, "icebreaker" vehicle for our DEI, Black History, and "Juneteenth" programs and initiatives.

- 3. How long must it be?** 10-30 seconds (60 max), at either 12 or 24fps (frames per second).
- 4. What is your objective with the piece?** To provide a mechanism and a reason for me to explore my love for the creative – this time through the creation of this non-linear piece or another completely different linear piece. I have to decide which idea I will actually create a brief stop motion piece on.

Such stop motion and other animations would show growth and range extending my brand to the audience that is my manager, team, and other groups. As such it would demonstrate and be a natural extension of my writing, graphics, and nascent video skills.

If I'm lucky. it will provide the basis for me submitting something for my company's use or consideration for further development. *Worst case my objective is to at least update my blog and creative portfolio.*

6. What is the overall idea? My take on a working light bulb maybe taking say "1000 tries" by Edison and his African American assistant, but what is important is the "1001" try to actually get it to work and thereby change the world!

While the most obvious import of Edison example has to do with the innovation and "invention" of the light bulb, I am more broadly trying to quickly remind all audiences that hard work, perseverance, and stick-to-it-ness, combined with a little luck, can and does pay off.

7. What is the storyline summary? For this very short [STOP Motion Animation 1](#) the storyline summary is Thomas Edison and his African American assistant, Lewis Latimore, working feverishly, diligently, and persistently over a lot of time to get their light bulb to actually work ----- only to be surprised, by an ungodly amount of time and effort --- that one day --- on the 1001 try --- that suddenly it did! NARRATION/HOST:

- 1. Who will lead us through the piece?** My *initial* thought is narration is not needed. . *As a novice, I would want to lean on the stop motion itself carrying a lot of the piece.* However if my thoughts change based on my research, and **if** I have **time** to add narration ----- I think I would like to be the "host" and narrator ---- *nasally voice and all!*
- 2. Narration ideas:** Script would need to be developed unless I did a quick, bulleted script on the fly. This is why narration is not likely at all. Besides I think I want to consider judiciously using *other* mediums and techniques. (e.g. see below)

MUSIC:

- 1. What is overall "mood" and "feel" of the piece?** "Old timey" . . . with music suggestive of same. Most definitely see listen to the music of link under look and feel description above.

AMBIENT AUDIO: Ambient audio ideas: *Still need to brainstorm the applicability of this and, if an opportunity strongly emerges, the specifics.*

1. **What is the “location” of the piece? If we close our eyes, where should we imagine that we are?** Back in Edison’s original “light bulb” lab -----or maybe not ----- which I believe may have been in one of the back rooms of his house.

***NOTE:** My storyboard will have boards but will rely heavily on annotations as I am too far committed to inserting such a simpler graphics cartoons, thinking that my drawing skills were lacking.

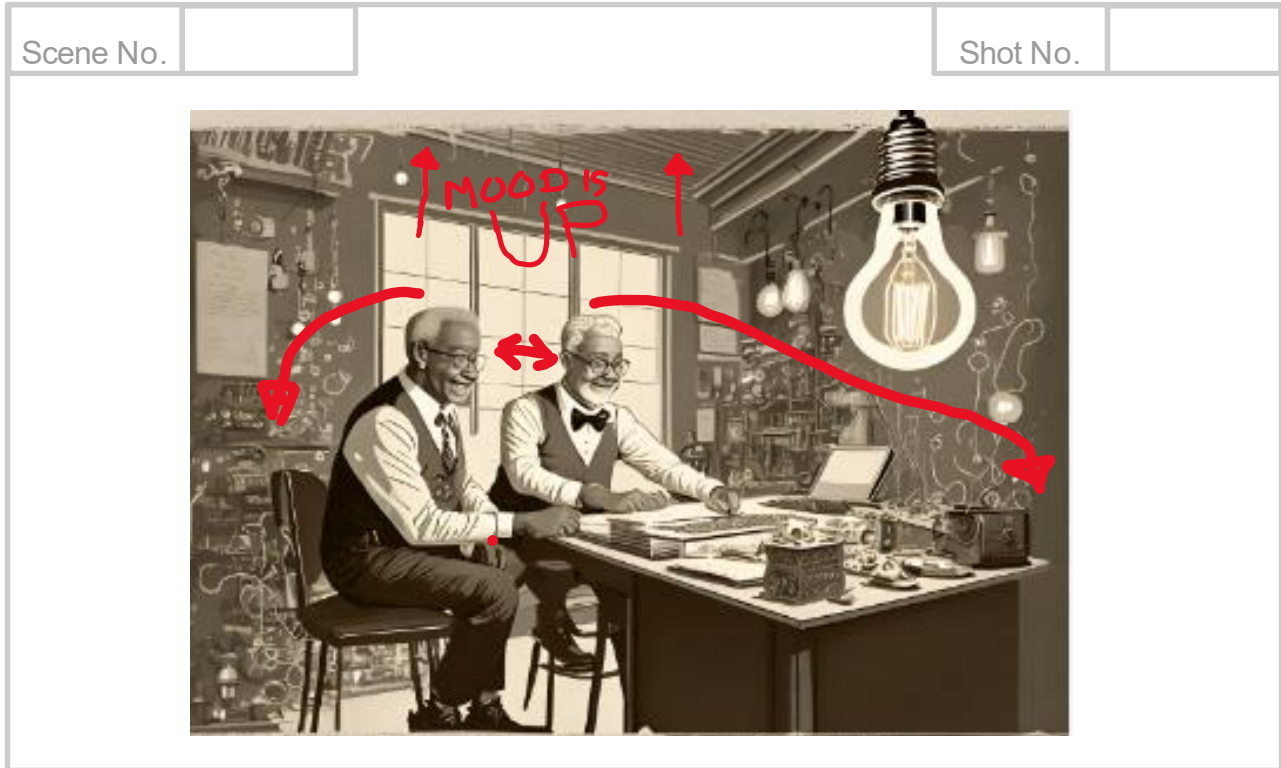
I also went with inserting graphics cartoons after understanding that this is acceptable and after watching an initial storyboard how to video suggesting that your story board can be anything you want them to be.

I now believe, however, that my story board attempts should be more effective with less annotations and more simple hand drawings which I now realize that I am capable of producing.

(____ Ideally the two men ALSO MOVE TO INTERACT on some level with EACH OTHER! extremely briefly, if at all)

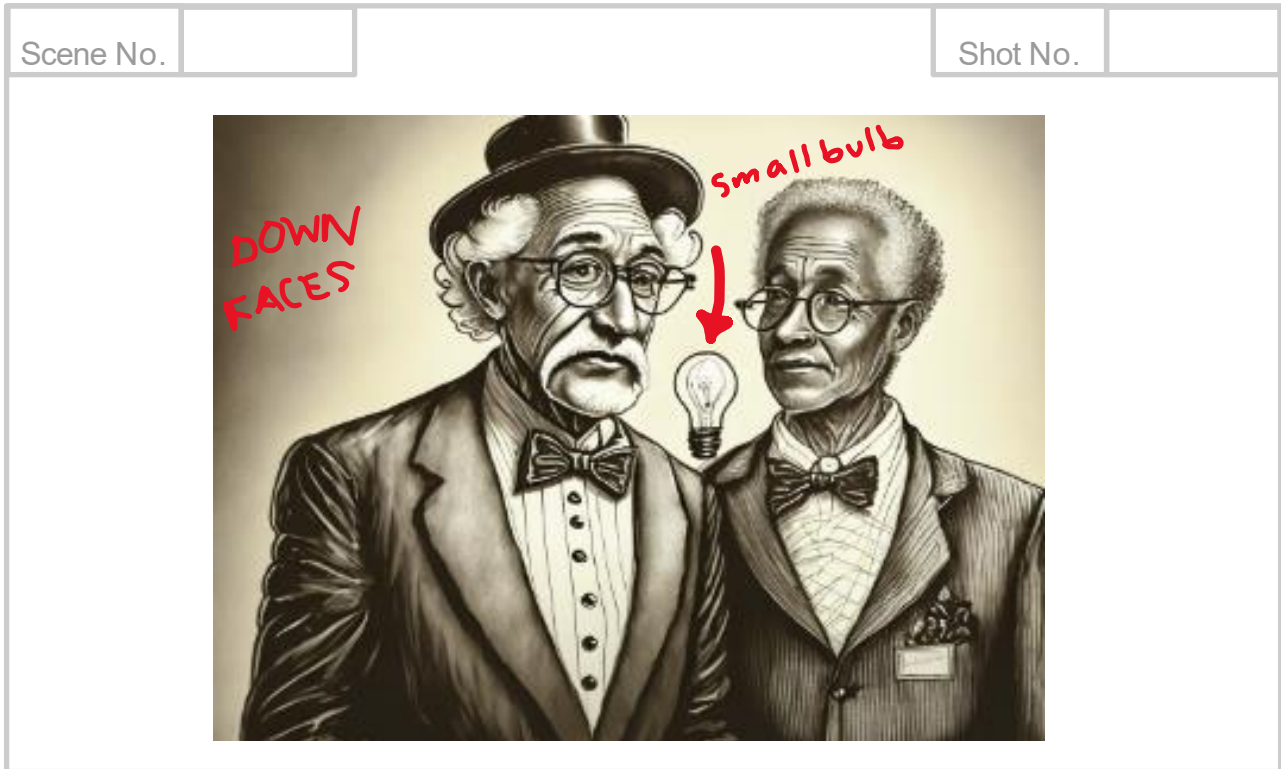

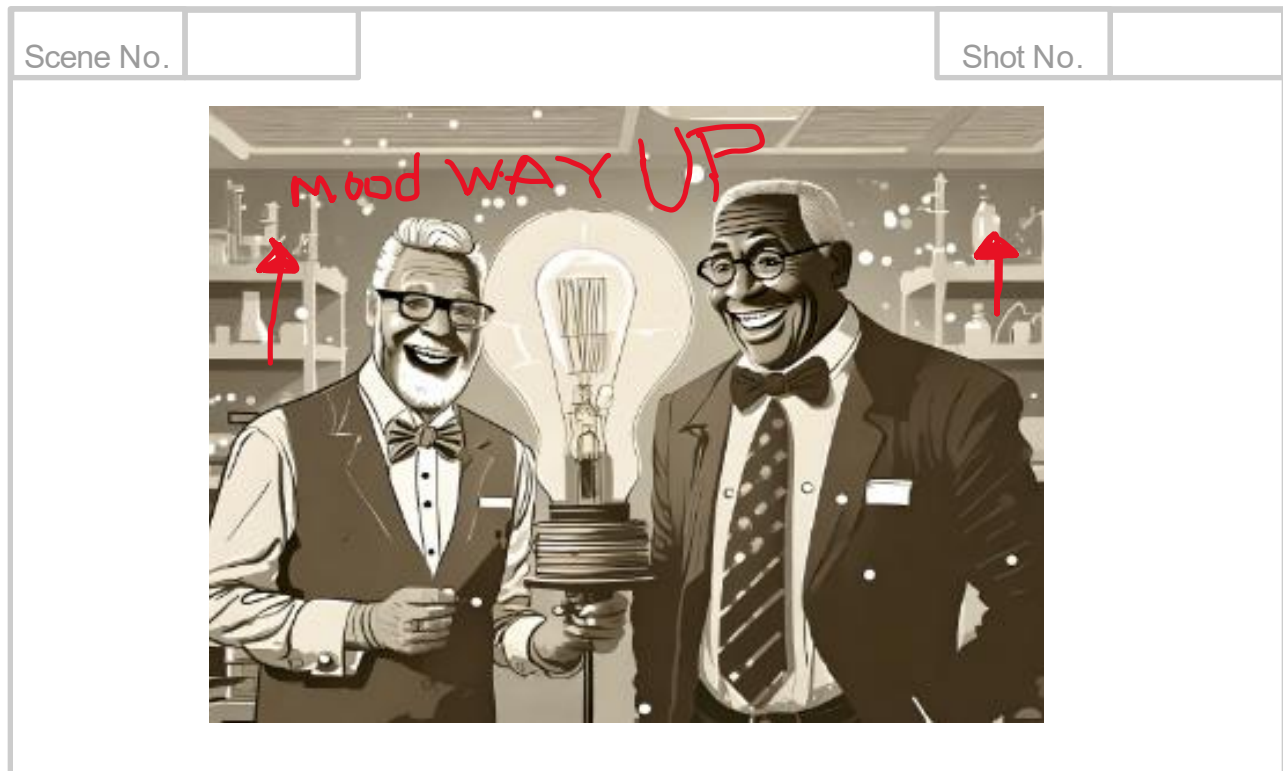
