STOP Motion Animation 2:

- 1. Your name: Kevin Pointer Sr.
- 2. Story idea # 2/ STOP Motion Animation: Working Title: "Pay Da Bill!!"
- 3. Linear or Non-Linear? Non-Linear (I plan to use the Countdown technique)

The countdown is all about establishing an inevitable climax up near the top, and then building rhythmically towards that climax. The constant build should become more intense as you arrive closer to the end, until when the end (finally) happens, seeing the thing you've been waiting for brings a wave of satisfaction. To achieve this requires intensifying all of the elements at your disposal (sound, color, movement, etc.) at a consistent pace, even if that pace is either very slow or very fast. What matters is that the audience is clued into the countdown and can mentally follow the pacing to what will surely be a glorious end.

It's Friday night early June. He starts Moving and Partying in his tiny apartment to the music of ___ You Can't Touch This

Now the window AC unit is blowing feverishly and noisily, and the view out the window suggests it's the **PEAK** of **HEAT** and summer outside. A bunch of bills are slightly blowing on a card table with empty beer cans and two packs of Marlboro cigarettes on it. Most prominently and most visible is The February Electric Bill on the card table.

ii. The Build Up Starts

Now the next evening, **Saturday**, **late July**, and the Know-it-All, Hip Hop/Gangster-style character is heard yelling some unintelligible things to his wife (not in the scene) and THEN can be heard mumbling some nonsensical gibberish to himself as he picks up another **Late**, **February Electric Bill Notice** off the floor, because it has been blown off the card table.

An hour later, the phone rings. "Mr. Know-it-All", cigarette in mouth, senses who it is....THEN he be heard fussing to the experienced, and kind Electric Company Telephone Rep "to hell with the phone and electric company this month!" That he will pay his bill when the hell he gets good and damn ready!!" That he's been a customer to the freakin' electric for over 15 years! He punches his cell phone abruptly and cracks it!!

iii. The Continued Build Up

Now it's now its Mid-August, on another Friday evening and Know-it-All, Hip Hop/Gangster-style character is dancing, and grovin' HARD to Play That Funky Music". This music is playing LOUDER THAN EVER!!!!

Mean Homer" is really feeling himself and is wearing this CRAZY 90's get up as he JUMPS UP on the couch is now dancing to *Play That Funky Music* ... !!!! This guy thinks he is SO COOL!!!

iv. The Final Build Up/ "Cut Off"

Now it's Sunday in Late August on another Friday evening and the phone rings. Mr. Hip Hop, Know-it-All of course <u>knows</u> it's The Electric Company. With a **mean face** he doesn't answer the phone, but he is heard yelling to his wife (not in the scene) TO PAY THAT DAMN FEBRAURY ELECTRIC BILL BECAUSE HE <u>AINT</u> GONNA DO IT!

That he has <u>BETTER</u> things to do with his Thou wow overtime check. Mr. Hip Hop, Know-it-All proudly proclaims that the sorry electric company <u>CAN'T TOUCH THIS</u>!!

I guess the Electric Company "<u>COULD</u> touch that" --- He shoulda "Paid the Da Bill!!!"

CREATIVE BRIEF

STOP Motion Animation 2:

- 1. What must it be? In a few phrases: Light, Humorous, and Creative. Intro and Outro IF TIME NOW ----- IF NOT ------ IN THE FUTURE. I probably will use paper character and object "Cut Outs". Adobe Stock graphics and/or video and Adobe Premiere most likely will also be used to pull all of the visual, music, and sound elements together. I aim to do the piece pretty well for a stop motion and Adobe Premiere novice.
- 2. Who is it for? Since I work for an electric utility I see this as a light, levity piece for my company who, by nature, often defers to "the almighty customer". I hope, in particular, that most employees in customer service or customer-facing roles might find "Pay Day Bill!!" especially humorous. Who knows do we even dare share or modify such that the messaging can even be used as a sort of a humous call to action for customers in general or at least certain customers.

- **3.** How long must it be? 10-30 seconds (60 max), at either 12 or 24fps (frames per second).
- **4. What is your objective with the piece?** To provide a mechanism and a reason for me to explore my love for the creative this time through the creation of this non-linear piece or another completely different linear piece. I have to decide which idea I will actually create a brief stop motion piece on.

Such stop motion and other animations would show growth and range extending my brand to the audience that is my manager, team, and other groups. As such it would demonstrate and be a natural extension of my writing, graphics, and nascent video skills.

If I'm lucky. it will provide the basis for me submitting something for my company's use or consideration for further development. Worst case my objective is to at least update my blog and creative portfolio.

For this very short STOP Motion Animation 2 the storyline summary is that a Know-it-All, Hip Hop/Gangster-style character hopefully learns something the hard way: That after many months of ignoring the electric bill and instead gleefully singing and partying his way through much of the year he ultimately pays the price. This as one day he finds himself crying ---- in pitch blackness! This because the electric company has finally cut off his electricity!
- **8. Elevator pitch:** Remotely. Interested. In. Short. Humorous. Stop. Motion. Animations? Leme quickly hook you up with a text message link to my "Pay Da Bill!!"

10. Look and feel description:

The look and feel that of any carefree elements of the 80's and 90's. Ideally I intend to convey sort the feel of a simple, cheap apartment living.

If I'm lucky and it is practical and makes sense, I imagine presenting a small, truly neighborhood apartment in what I imagine to be Greenwich Village New York.

"OTHER"

NARRATION/HOST:

- 1. Who will lead us through the piece? My <u>initial</u> thought is narration is not needed. <u>As a novice, I would want to lean on the stop motion itself carrying a lot of the piece</u>. However if my thoughts change based on my research, and **if** I have **time** to add narration ----- I think I would like to be the "host" and narrator --- nasally voice and all!
- 2. **Narration ideas:** Script would need to be developed unless I did a quick, bulleted script on the fly. This is why narration is not likely at all. Besides I think I want to consider judiciously using <u>other</u> mediums and techniques. (e.g. see below)

MUSIC:

1. What is overall "mood" and "feel" of the piece? "80's" and "90's" 'gangster'/ hip hop music meets a know-it-all, outspoken Archie type of the 70's television hit show, "All in the Family".

AMBIENT AUDIO: Ambient audio ideas: *Still need to brainstorm this applicability of this and, if an opportunity strongly emerges, the specifics.*

1. What is the "location" of the piece? If we close our eyes, where should we imagine that we are? Back in the "80's" and "90's", say at a small, and distinctly lower middle class <u>old-style neighborhood</u> apartment in Greenwich Village New York.

STOP Motion $\underline{2}$:

1. **WHAT?** I want to create my visual script using storyboards. *Ideally I want to be sure to map out each "story beat" so that someone unfamiliar with the story would be able to tell what is going on.

*NOTE: My storyboard will have boards but will rely heavily on annotations as I am too far committed to inserting such a simpler graphics cartoons, thinking that my drawing skills were lacking.

I also went with inserting graphics cartoons after understanding that this is acceptable and after watching an initial storyboard how to video suggesting that your story board can be anything you want them to be.

I now believe, however, that my storyboard attempts should be more effective with less annotations and more simple hand drawings which I now realize that I am capable of producing.

- 3. **HOW?** Once I've created my storyboard frames, I plan to **insert those images** with hand drawn elements, and full supporting text underneath those images. See below.

i. The Beginning

One straight forward, in-you-face--looking, Hip Hop-style and Know-it All character, with his "wife beater" tee shirt and gold chain on.

This is an opening scene-establishing wide shot, where he often can be seen sitting his tiny couch holding a can of beer, watching, I imagine, old reruns of "All in the Family".






ii. The Build Up Starts / Is Suggested

iii. The Build Up Continues


The most prominent and the most visible bill is <u>The **February** Electric Bill</u> ------This is a wide angle shot
